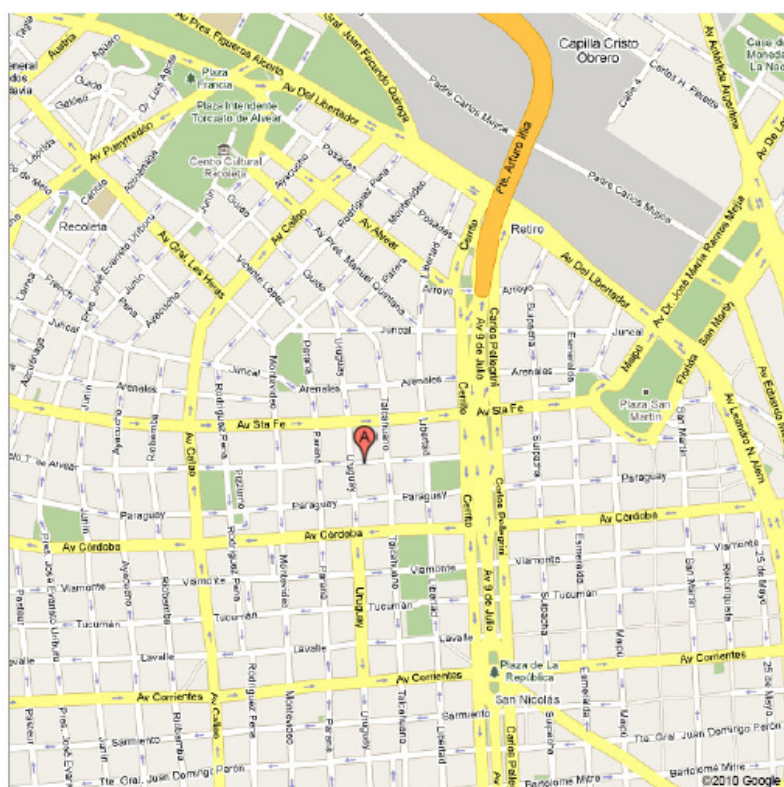

**Travel to Buenos Aires**

There are direct flights to Ezeiza Airport, which is the main international airport of Argentina. Ezeiza airport is located 30 km from Buenos Aires City.

**Transportation from Ezeiza Airport to the hotel**

1) Chauffeur car (remis) is the recommended means of transportation to the hotel. After passing customs, there are several booths offering their transportation services:

The single fare should be in the order of 150 argentinean pesos (cash or credit card).

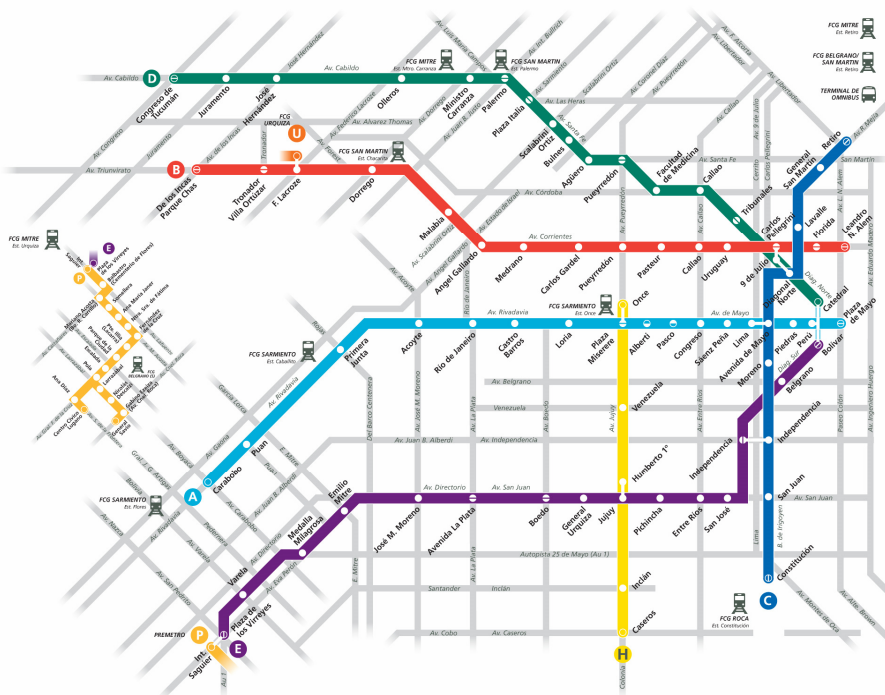
2) Shuttle services are offered only by Manuel Tienda León (MTL) (<http://www.tiendaleon.com.ar/home/home.asp>). The shuttle leaves Ezeiza (at intervals between 30 and 60 minutes, depending on the time) arriving ~ 45 minutes later in the City centre (Avda. Madero and San Martín, close to the Sheraton Hotel in Buenos Aires). From there you will need to take a regular taxi to the Hotel. The single fare for the shuttle (as of march 2010) is 45 argentinean pesos one way, and 85 round trip (cash or credit card). In addition the regular taxi from the MTL city centre terminal to the hotel would be about 25 pesos (only cash).

3) Non recommended options include: regular taxis from Ezeiza and public buses (only for adventurous).

**Public Transport in Buenos Aires**

We recommend taxis, particularly *Radio Taxis*, for transportation within the City.

Buenos Aires has an extended transportation network, including buses, subway (subte) and trains. Subways may be the easiest option for non local citizens. Tickets can be purchased at all the stations. Three subway stations (“Callao” and “Tribunales” of line D, and “San Martín” of line C) are about 10 minutes walk from the Blue Tree Hotel Recoleta – Ker.

The currency of the Argentina is Peso.

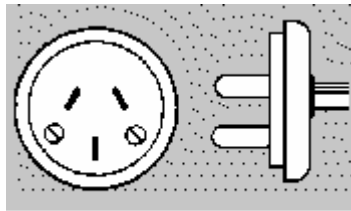
**Facilities**
